

# 14 Kid-Friendly Restaurants in Philadelphia

Where to take the whole family out to eat

Philly's population is getting younger and while that means plenty of new **bars** and **trendy restaurants** opening, it also means the city is full of young families. Going out with little ones can be a challenge, but some restaurants make it easier with kids menus, booths, and comfort food.

In Old City, **City Tavern** holds an official title of Best Kids Menu in America, but chocolate-themed **Max Brenner** gives the old-fashioned colonial eatery a run for its money with the most fun kids menu in town.

This international chocolate-themed restaurant has one of the biggest and most playful **kids menus** in town. Children can “paint” their own smiling pizza (with tomato sauce and toppings), get sliders in a mini spaceship, and share the Chocolate Mess Party — warm chocolate mud cake in a chocolate swimming pool, with whipped cream mountains, ice cream bowling balls, chocolate rocks, and toffee sauce from candy bees.
